

Kraft board divider inserts

SLOTTED GRID · TOOL-FREE · GLUE-FREE

CP-DIV-0909 3 × 3, 9 cell

CP-DIV-0916 4 × 4, 16 cell

The case for the divider is not that it protects better than fill does. In a well-packed carton the two end up close. It is that a wall does not depend on the packer — it is in the right place before anyone reaches for it, it is in the same place on the thousandth carton as on the first, and it is still there when the carton is opened at the other end.

SIX REASONS TO SPECIFY IT



SEPARATION

A wall on all four sides

Every cell is closed by board on all four sides and open only at the top, so no item touches the next one or the carton wall at any point in the journey. Fill can do the same job, but only if the packer puts enough of it in the right places; a wall is in the right place before the first item goes in.



JOINT

No glue, staples or tape

The whole insert is two shapes of the same board, slotted so they hold each other. Nothing is added to make the joint and nothing has to be removed to undo it, which is what lets the set come apart flat at the far end and go back together unchanged.



STORAGE

Flat until the moment it is needed

A made-up insert is mostly air, and air is the most expensive thing on a warehouse rack. This one is a flat bundle of strips until the bench needs it, so the same shelf holds many times the number of inserts a pre-made grid would.



ASSEMBLY

Twenty seconds, no tool

Four joints on the nine-cell set, made by hand, with nothing to reach for and nothing to run out of. That is the cost of the flat bundle, and it is worth stating plainly rather than glossing: this is the one product in the range that asks the bench for time.



CERTIFICATION

Listings resolved from the record

Every mark on a CambiumPak sheet is read out of the SKU record rather than placed by hand. The divider holds CircleFibre 90 and ReturnReady, and holds them as inferred listings: the family is not in the published catalogue yet, and the sheet says so rather than quietly rounding up.



END OF LIFE

The same board as the carton

The insert is specified to the grade of the carton it goes into, so the whole pack breaks down as one material with nothing to sort. There is no glue line to fail in the pulper and no metal to pull out at the sorting station.

WHAT THE LISTINGS CERTIFY



CircleFibre 90

Post-consumer fibre content verified by mill declaration and lot sampling. The 90 is the threshold, not the score.

ReturnReady

Accepted whole into standard kerbside paper collection, with no liner, laminate or adhesive to separate out first.

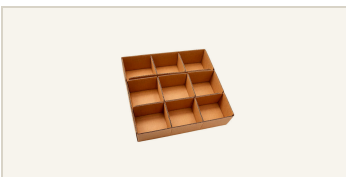
RECYCLED CONTENT

72% recycled by weight

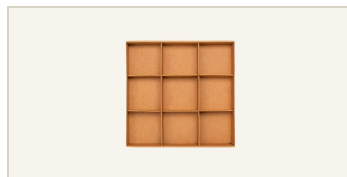

WARRANTY

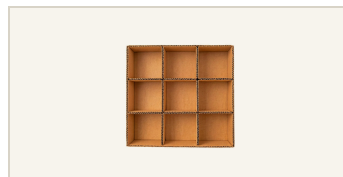
Term	Twelve months from despatch

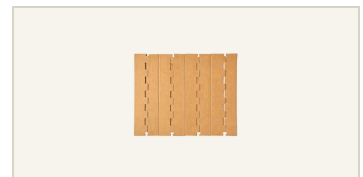
Three-quarter, assembled
