These four are not alternatives so much as answers to different questions: what wraps the item, what fills what is left, what separates one item from the next, and what defends the carton itself. The wrap is the only one of the four that is not the size it works at until the moment it is used, and that is worth saying plainly because it cuts both ways. It buys back store space, pallet space and inbound freight that the other three spend. It gives up the ability to change its mind: once a length is drawn it is drawn, and a sheet cut too long is wrap that has been paid for and will be thrown away.

Recycled content is banded here on purpose. A band is what compares across formats without implying a precision the formats do not share. The figure by weight, for this family, is on the features and benefits sheet.

Listings are named, not defined. What each mark certifies, and against which test, is on the features and benefits sheet.

CHOOSING BETWEEN THEM

Choose honeycomb wrap

When one item needs a layer around it and you would otherwise reach for bubble. The expanded cells grip rather than slide, and the roll stores flat until the moment it is drawn off.

Choose crinkle void fill

When the item is already wrapped or boxed and what remains is empty volume. It is also the only one of the four the customer is meant to see, which is why it is undyed.

Choose the divider insert

When a carton carries several items that must not touch each other or the wall. It costs bench time the other three do not, and saves fill on every cell it closes off.

Choose the corner protector

When the load is palletised or stacked more than two high. It protects the carton rather than the contents, which is a different job from the other three.

Against crinkle fill the question is whether the item needs a layer on it or whether what is left needs filling, and most parcels want one of each. Against a divider grid it is one item against several. Against bubble film it gives up transparency and the habit of decades, and removes the separation step at the kerb entirely — one material out of the parcel, where there had been two.

Loads, board grades and closures are taken from the CambiumPak product specification. The honeycomb wrap, the crinkle void fill and the corner protector are ratified catalogue families. Figures for the divider insert are inferred from the nearest ratified family member and are not yet in the published catalogue.
